OUR PRIORITIES

Young People

Aim:

The NNPT is committed to the continued engagement of all aspects of our community and in particular our young people.

Why?

It is important for the Police and the younger members of the community that we are integrated and work together to solve any issues that they have. With greater contact and trust between all parties any issues can productively be addressed and dealt with.

How?

Ensuring that the visits to schools and youth clubs are being undertaken, in particular by those Officers that have responsibility for them

Public meetings specifically aimed at young people within the NNPT

Continued multi-agency engagement in improving outcomes for young people and in particular drug education

Supporting but challenging young people—detering and diverting from anti-social behaviour, under age drinking, substance abuse and risk taking behaviour

Building mutual respect and trust

Roads and Drivers

Aim:

We will seek to improve both the safety and courtesy on our roads and work to reduce the number of collisions especially those that result in serious injury or death.

Why?

Our community partners have told us that inconsiderate use of our roads is both a safety issue and a quality of life issue.

How?

Utilising dedicated support from Roads Policing Officers to assist Officers within the NNPT

Enforcing the law with locally run campaigns targeting locally raised issues

Responding to intelligence and reports of speeding and defective vehicles

Continuing to be visible at the schools and other areas where vulnerability is highlighted.

Engaging with the Roads Policing Unit in 'Operation Carbon' ,to improve safety for the 16-25 year age group

Community Policing

Aim:

Working with all our partners to continue to improve our safe and vibrant northern communities

Why?

We have a major role to play in keeping the North recognised as a place that is great to live and work

How?

We will continue with our innovative use of social media to inform and engage with the community, in particular the young people within the NNPT

We will increase our availability and accessibility

Continued 'firm but fair' policing for the night time economy to promote the North as a good and safe place to be .

Strive towards greater integration with our partner agencies.

Be more open to the views of the community and their concerns for what is happening in their community

PERFORMANCE TARGETS

The Policing year 2009-2010 was particularly good for the reduction in the level of recorded crime in the NNPT . For 2010-11 we aim to maintain this reduction and further drive down the three year average as a result.

We will continue with our proactive stance in the areas of drugs, drunkenness and public order, maintaining the current high levels of activity

We will seek to deliver a detection rate at least equivalent to the current three year average.

We will seek to reduce the number of road traffic collisions from last year by 10 per cent.
